Dear President Obama,

I write expressing my deep concern regarding the implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA).

Countless neighbors in my hometown recently received word from their employer, Sesame Place that their hours would be cut and health insurance terminated, presumably to comply with the burdensome and costly regulations enforced within the Affordable Care Act.

Sesame Place employs 1,650 people and is the number one tourist destination in Bucks County, driving \$75 million in economic activity into the local economy.

Enclosed is the notice terminating healthcare coverage for these workers.

As the law was explained to Americans, we were promised that if we like our health insurance plan, we can keep it. We were told that the healthcare law would not raise taxes, only to see that 20 taxes are being used to fund this law. The law was supposed to cover all Americans, only to learn that over 30 million Americans will remain uninsured.

While the Affordable Care Act was intended to help Americans, this law is hurting real people in my district and around the country. I continue to believe it must be repealed and replaced with a sustainable solution that promotes affordable access to world class healthcare for which our nation is recognized. Thus far, the president has signed in law seven provisions repealing parts of the Affordable Care Act.

While I believe this law should be repealed and replaced, please consider affording the American people the same one year delay granted to businesses by your Administration. As our President, this would be a strong first step to lead us to a path that avoids posturing and conflicts in funding the government through a Continuing Resolution and making good on our obligations via the Debt Ceiling.
