A BILL

To amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to provide for coverage under the Medicaid program of non-invasive prenatal genetic screening.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Expanded Genetic
5 Screening Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. MEDICAID COVERAGE OF NON-INVASIVE PRENATAL**
2 **GENETIC SCREENING.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1905 of the Social Secu-
4 rity Act (42 U.S.C. 1396d) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a)(3)—

6 (A) in subparagraph (A), by striking at the
7 end “and”;

8 (B) in subparagraph (B), by inserting
9 “and” after the semicolon; and

10 (C) by adding at the end the following new
11 subparagraph:

12 “(C) non-invasive prenatal genetic screen-
13 ing for pregnant women of all age groups (pro-
14 vided in a facility, a home, or other setting),
15 subject to the informed consent requirement de-
16 scribed in subsection (jj);”;

17 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
18 section:

19 “(jj) INFORMED CONSENT REQUIREMENT FOR NON-
20 INVASIVE PRENATAL GENETIC SCREENING.—

21 “(1) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of subsection
22 (a)(3)(C), the informed consent requirement de-
23 scribed in this subsection for non-invasive prenatal
24 genetic screening furnished to a pregnant woman is
25 that, prior to furnishing the screening to the woman,
26 the provider of the screening gives the woman a full

1 disclosure that includes, at a minimum, the following
2 information:

3 “(A) The limitations of the screening plat-
4 form for any genetic screen or test with the
5 goal to identify risk or diagnose a genetic condi-
6 tion.

7 “(B) Any potential interferences that may
8 affect the screening’s performance.

9 “(C) Information about predictive values
10 used by the screening based on appropriate
11 matching population and inherent risk factors
12 based on age, family history, and other
13 aneuploidy risk factors (such as ultrasound ab-
14 normalities).

15 “(D) The need for follow-up diagnostic
16 testing to confirm true positive results before
17 decisions are made about irrevocable clinical
18 intervention.

19 “(2) NO MEDICAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE FOR
20 SCREENINGS PROVIDED WITHOUT CONSENT.—No
21 payment may be made under section 1903(a) with
22 respect to a non-invasive prenatal genetic screening
23 that is furnished to a pregnant woman without
24 meeting the requirement described in paragraph
25 (1).”.

1 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 1903(i) of
2 the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396b(i)) is amend-
3 ed—

4 (1) in paragraph (26), by striking “; or”;

5 (2) in paragraph (27), by striking the period
6 and inserting “; or”; and

7 (3) by inserting after paragraph (27) the fol-
8 lowing new paragraph:

9 “(28) with respect to amounts expended for
10 non-invasive prenatal genetic screening services fur-
11 nished to a pregnant woman, unless the informed
12 consent requirement of section 1905(jj) is met.”.
